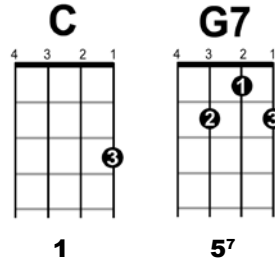


Ain't No Bugs On Me
